

We are offering up to 15 residencies in 2025 to professional, emerging, and early-carer children's storybook creators living in Australia.

In 2024 Nan Tien Temple, in collaboration with South Coast Writers Centre, offered a successful 7-14 day writers in residence.

As part of our growing commitment to supporting Australian children's literature, Nan Tien Temple has recently commissioned awardwinning author Karen Hendriks (NSW) and illustrator Emma Stuart (VIC) to create our very first children's book, *Seeking Treasure with Bodhi*. This residency continues that mission, providing a unique opportunity for other talented creators to find inspiration in the peaceful surrounds of the Temple.



2024 Resident Writer

This is a rare opportunity to step away from daily distractions and immerse yourself in a peaceful, culturally rich environment. Whether you're a well published author or illustrator, or an emerging talent, this residency is designed to nurture creativity and provide inspiration that will feed into your early stage or upcoming project. While we have a short lead in time for the 2025 residence, we didn't want to wait until October 2026 to start. No time like the present!



About Nan Tien Temple (Wollongong, NSW)

Nan Tien Temple is the largest Buddhist Temple in the Southern Hemisphere and the youngest building on the NSW State Heritage Register.



Since opening in 1995, Nan Tien has served as a place of learning, peace, and cultural exchange.

Set within tranguil gardens and overlooking the Illawarra escarpment, it offers a truly unique environment that has inspired thousands of visitors from around the world. Through this residency, we invite children's writers and illustrators to bring the spirit of this place into their emerging stories and images, encouraging young readers to explore themes of stillness, presence, connection, and mindfulness.


What the Residency Includes

Eligibility Criteria



Professional

To be considered a professional Writer or Illustrator, applicants must meet all the following:

- Be the author or illustrator of three or more published children's books, defined as a book published with an ISBN and barcode.
- Eligible publications include traditional print, e-books, selfpublished works, or digital-first books distributed nationally.
- Picture books, junior fiction, middle-grade or graphic narratives for children are all eligible genres.
- Publications must demonstrate literary or illustrative excellence and must not include advertising, instruction manuals, promotional blogs, or media content created solely for commercial or entertainment platforms.



2024 Resident Writers

Emerging

Applicants must meet one of the following:

- Authored or illustrated one or more published children's books, defined as a book published with an ISBN and barcode.
- Creator of a body of shorter work for children (e.g., magazine stories, online literary journal content, comic panels or zines for children) and demonstrable progress on a first major work.






Under 35

To class yourself in this category, you must fulfil all the following:

- Writers under 35 years old at the time of application.
- Have been or are currently involved in the writing sector.
- Have published literary material in print, visual or broadcast media.
- And are working towards achieving their first publication defined as a book published with an ISBN and barcode.

This category is designed to support emerging writers under the age of 35. However, if you are slightly over the age limit and feel your circumstances align with the intent of this category, you are welcome to reach out — we are open to discussion.





What We Ask From Residents

1. Creative Response – Theme: *Connection*

This residency is offered free of charge (valued up to \$2250 for 11 nights). In exchange, residents are to submit a short creative response inspired by their time at the Temple under the theme. *Connection*.

- **Writers:** A creative piece up to 500 words.
- **Illustrators:** A single A4 colour illustration on quality paper.

This polished piece is to be submitted within 2 weeks finishing the residency and will be considered for publication in a residency anthology with full credit to you and used for educational purposes such as school excursion workshops and is not released for sale. View our <u>2024 Anthology</u> to see the quality of the work and publication details.

Unlike other residencies that may require public talks or workshops, we keep our expectations in light so you can focus on your work.

2. Acknowledgements

Like other residencies, the recipient is required to acknowledge the 2025 Nan Tien Temple Australian Children's Writers and Illustrators Residency in any published work associated with the time spent at Nan Tien Temple.





How To Apply?


Nan Tien Temple accepts applications online. Simply complete the application form available on our website and submit it by the closing date. For any questions or assistance, please contact our team.







Selection Criteria

Applications will be assessed by a panel made up of representatives from Nan Tien Temple, a professional Australian writer or illustrator and book publishing industry.

We are looking for:





- A demonstrated commitment to your craft.
- A clear explanation of how the residency will support your project.
- A resonance with Buddhist values, such as peace, mindfulness, compassion, and loving-kindness, either thematically in your past or proposed work, or as a personal value set.

An openness to cultural and spiritual reflection, and an interest in creating works that inspire empathy, inner stillness, and connection for young readers.



Plane

Shellharbour/Albion Park Regional Airport

Located 15 minute drive from the Temple. Contact us and we can arrange airport transfers.



Car

Free visitor carpark

Entry via Nolan Street Unanderra. This is the entrance to the Pilgrim Lodge.



Train

Train to Unanderra station (South Coast Line)

Catch a Taxi to the Temple from the train station or walk 15-20 minutes



Bus

Bus 34 - Wollongong to Warrawong Catch Bus (Route 34) at Unanderra Shops (right-hand side of the station near Caltex petrol station) and alight at the Temple's back entrance on Nolan Street.







Who is eligible to apply for the residency?

The residency is open to published and emerging writers and illustrators of children's literature based in Australia and over 18 years. We particularly welcome applicants with a new or early-stage project seeking creative inspiration.

Is there a cost to participate in the residency?

No, it's completely free. The residency is fully funded by the Temple, including accommodation and meals. Residents will need to cover their own travel costs to and from the Temple. We ask in return for a small, polished piece of new work of acceptable standard based on your residency, using the theme *Connection*, and complete a survey form.

What kind of accommodation is provided?

Residents stay in private rooms at Pilgrim Lodge, located within the tranquil grounds of Nan Tien Temple. Rooms are simple, clean, and peaceful, designed to support reflection and creative focus. Before 9am and after 5pm you will experience the temple as a private resident and free to explore.

Do I need to follow religious or spiritual practices to attend?

Not at all. The residency is a cultural and creative offering open to people of all backgrounds. While participants are welcome to join meditation sessions or temple activities, it is entirely optional.



What is expected of me during my residency?

We ask that you spend your time immersed in your project(s) and the environment. We also invite each resident to create a short piece (500 words or A4 polished drawing of acceptable standard) inspired by their experience, and share a reflection of community at the conclusion. We also ask that the community life at a Buddhist temple is respected through the dress and no meat or alcohol to brought onsite. During the meals in the Dining Hall, we observe 'Noble Silence'.



How will my submitted work be used? (A4 artwork or the 500 written piece)

Throughout the year, the Temple has a steady stream of primary school excursions, and we're excited to expand the way we support both visiting teachers and our own staff in delivering engaging, creative experiences. learning As an children's Australian author or illustrator your contribution will be featured in a beautifully printed A4 or A5 booklet. You will receive a copy of this. This publication will be used as a resource for teachers and our staff at the temple, showcasing how your storytelling or illustration can draw inspiration from the unique atmosphere of the Temple. This is a great way to further promote you while we both work to inspire young people to enjoy books.

What does the Temple gain from the Residency?

The Temple is enthusiastic about exploring future commissions for children's This storybooks. residency offers a meaningful way for the Monastics to connect with Australian creatives. building affinities, discovering your work, and potentially paving the way for future collaborations. As an education and cultural centre with two libraries and a range of study children's programs, supporting literature is a natural and valued extension of our mission. We're excited by the opportunities this creates to deepen our role in the community and explore creative ways to share wisdom and learning together.

Can I work on an existing project?

Yes, especially if you are in the early stages or open to letting the residency shape its direction. We're particularly interested in works that can absorb and reflect the themes of peace, mindfulness, intercultural connection, and/or the visual and cultural richness of the Temple.

Can I bring my family or collaborators?

Some residents may use this time for solo reflection and focused creative development. If residents wish to have their family join them, families can book rooms with the Pilgrim Lodge where meals and accommodation will be at their own expense.

What if I wish to head out after dinner?

This is fine however, the reception desk closes at 8pm as our members are early risers. We kindly ask you to consider this. Please let the Lodge know before 2PM if you are not attending dinner so we can inform the kitchen of correct meal numbers.

Are there structured activities or is it self-directed?

The residency is largely self-directed, with the option to join temple tours, retreat day, meditation sessions, or quiet tea gatherings. These offerings are meant to support your creative rhythm, not interrupt it.

How do I apply?

Applications are submitted online via HERE. You'll need to provide a short project description, a sample of your work, and a short statement about why this residency is meaningful to you.


